



BASIC NEEDS

- **253,940 meals** were provided to feed individuals and families
- **289 individuals** were provided assistance including safe shelter due to domestic or sexual violence
- **32 clients** received assistance after a disaster such as a fire or flooding
- **420 callers** received assistance by contacting the 24 hr. crisis hotline
- **289 school children** received basic items such as clothing, shoes, food, medicine, and school supplies as well as support for field trips

EDUCATION

- **2,482 children and families** benefitted from early childhood, character-building and educational programs and resources
- **250 first grade students** were given a free book through UWBB's early literacy initiative, READ UNITED, and volunteers read a story to every first grade class

INCOME

- **104 children** received subsidized child care enabling parents to work

HEALTH

- **2,166 people** benefitted from medical care including education, assistance, diagnosis, and prevention

We invest in accountable programs

- The Community Investment Team, a team of local volunteers, meets each year to review agency programs and distribute locally raised funds



- UWBB funds must be used for direct human services, not administration

We leverage the collective power of the community

- UWBB assists local agencies leverage matching dollars for our community from local, state, federal and private funding sources
- UWBB seeks to create unique collaborations among government entities, education entities, private businesses, non-profits, foundations, and individual donors



READ UNITED, an initiative of UWBB's **Women UNITED**, was developed to encourage a love of reading in students and provide a resource to get them started on this journey.



The **Volunteer Income Assistance Program (VITA)** is an example of UWBB's involvement, along with community partners, to serve residents of the Big Bend through proactive and collaborative solutions to improve their long-term financial stability and quality of life.



ReadingPals, an initiative of UWBB's **Women UNITED**, is improving the reading ability of children. **ReadingPals** relies on hundreds of volunteers every year to read one-on-one with children who have been identified as struggling readers.

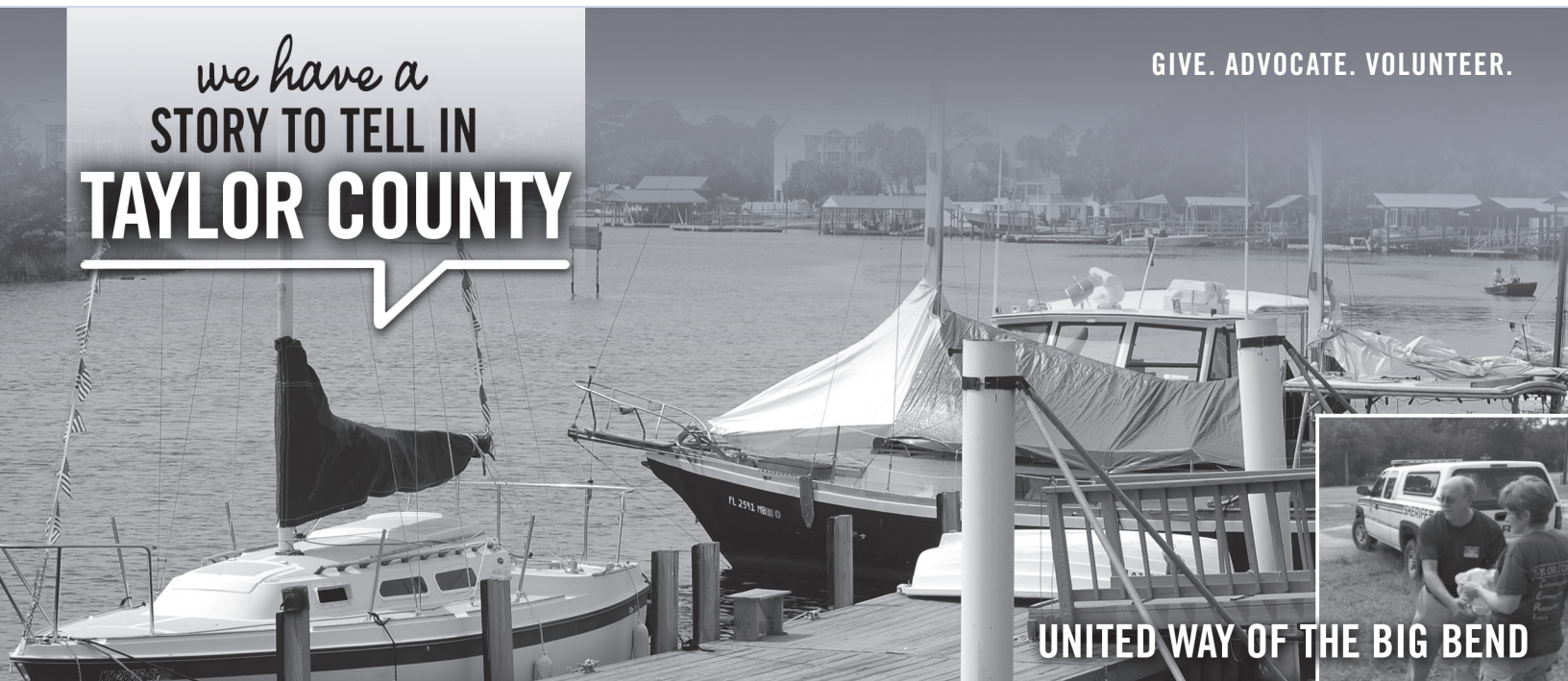
